



# AUSCYCLING REGIONAL COMMISSAIRE COURSE



The AusCycling Regional Commissaire (RC) course is designed to provide a flexible delivery for the accreditation of Regional Commissaire for members interested in being part of AusCycling as a Commissaire.

The course is aimed at officials who assist at sanctioned AusCycling club and state events. This course focuses on the more technical aspects of each AusCycling discipline and after completing this course, you will be accredited to officiate at State/Territory events.

Regional Commissaires can become accredited in one or more of the following disciplines: BMX, Cyclo-cross, Mountain Bike, Road, Track.

This course has five (5) theory modules and a concussion module which are common across all disciplines and a discipline specific theory module, which are delivered through e-learning. Completion of the common theory modules is required once only and additional Regional Commissaire accreditations can be added through completing further discipline specific modules, plus a practical assessment, where

## Online E-learning Modules



Regional Commissaire theory modules take the participant on a journey, which examines:

### General Cycling:

The Commissaire in Action; Roles and Responsibilities; Communication and People Management; Safety and Risk; Bikes and Equipment; Concussion Management.

### Discipline Specific:

Discipline specific modules educate the aspiring Commissaire on the more technical aspects of their discipline of interest, including introducing the AusCycling Technical Regulations – General and the AusCycling Technical Regulations for the discipline of interest.

## Practical Assessment



The second component of the Regional Commissaire course is a practical assessment session where participants will be mentored and assisted in the development of their Commissaire skills.

Road & Track: one (1) practical assessment is required.

BMX: two (2) practical assessments are required.

Mountain Biking & Cyclo-cross: no practical assessment is required (at the current time).

Practical sessions will be scheduled regularly throughout the year and can be booked into via your eLearning account.

## Pre-Requisites



In order to undertake the RC course, participants must be a minimum of 16 years of age.

For those interested in Regional Commissaire – BMX, you must have completed the BMX Club Official course.

Other pre-requisites required are:

- Working with Children Check or equivalent (or exemption relevant to your state or territory legislation).
- Sport Australia Community Officiating General Principles

Commissaires must hold a current AusCycling membership at a minimum of Non-Ride Membership.

## Finalising Accreditation



Your Regional Commissaire accreditation will be issue upon completion of pre-requisites, on-line theory and practical assessment (where required). If your course does not have a practical assessment (currently Mountain Biking and Cyclo-cross) your accreditation will be issued at the completion of the pre-requisites and on-line theory modules. The Regional Commissaire Accreditation is valid for 4 years.

**Cost:** The course is at *NO COST* to members of AusCycling
