Riders Note	 All riders will carry the same number across all races this weekend. Riders will need to sign on at the beginning of each day. If they choose to withdraw, they must tell RD an hour before hand. Spectator entry will be at the rider entrance as we have been doing most of the season. Spectator Entry will be \$10 for adults and \$5 for children (14yo and younger). Desk will be at the rider entry. Handlers will be \$10 per Handler. 1 Handler per rider.

Technical Regulations	 All Competitors will adhere to the Rules – as noted in the AusCycling Track Regulations. The rulings will be made in accordance with the Track Regulations. All individual events will be held as an "Open Championships". Team events will be held as "Club Team Championships". Riders affiliated through any club are eligible for medals however only riders affiliated with NSW-based clubs are eligible to be declared the NSW State Champion (title awarded to the best place riders from an NSW-based club). Any tall riders must have an exemption to be able to use the Category 2 & 3 height regulations. If you do not have an exemption - standard position applies. Please see the UCI Equipment's Regulations information sheet for further information. For the list of tall riders please see the officials resource page. TEAM RULES The Following rules will be applied for the 2023 Club Team Sprint and Team Pursuit Championship - New South Wales: UCI Track Regulations "3.2.149 Teams shall be made up of riders entered for this event. The composition of a team may be modified from one heat to another. An incomplete team may not take the start. The team manager must notify the commissaires of any changes at least 30 minutes before the relevant competition round start. Up to six riders may be nominated for a team. Interstate clubs may participate but are not eligible for medal round rideoffs. Team Composition - For the purposes of forming teams, a rider's club of representation is their primary road/track club. Any riders must transfer clubs at least 30 days prior to the first day of competition to be eligible. If a non-road/track club inder has a secondary club which is considered a road and track club, it will automatically consider their primary club for the purpose of entry regulations (State/Territory Championships). A club may permit a rider to participate as their secondary club should they not be selec
