Mighty 11's Test Team and Memorial Class Regulations

1. MIGHTY 11S TEST TEAM

1.1 Test Team Structure

The Test Team shall consist of two (2) teams made up of:

- Four (4) male riders aged 11 years + reserve.
- Four (4) female riders aged 11 years + reserve.

The male teams from each country will compete against each other, while the female teams from each country will also compete against each other.

1.2 Events and Location

There are two (2) events each year, one held in Australia and the other in New Zealand:

- Event 1 will be held in Australia in conjunction with a calendared meet of standing within the first half of the year.
- Event 2 will be held In New Zealand during October at the BMXNZ North Island Title event.

1.3 Entries

All riders entered in the Mighty 11s Test Team must also be entered in, and compete to their best of their ability in, the Mighty 11s Memorial Class.

1.4 Replacement/Reserve Rider

Both countries will provide the other with a list of the top Eight (8) placed boys and the top Eight (8) placed girls from the trial/qualifier held.

a. Reserve Rider

Both countries are encouraged to carry a 5th rider (boy and girl) on the away leg of the test. The replacement will be the next "available" rider in order of qualifying (this may not be the 5th rider it could be the 8th rider at the time).

b. Replacement Rider

Each country will be provided a one (1) time substitution during the event for each boys and girls team. (Note: Riders can be substituted prior to racing commencing as many times as needed to address rider injury/sickness).

All changes prior and during racing, must be advised to the other Team Management, advising of the rider standing down & the replacement rider.

1.5 Test Team Age Format

- Event 1 Must be 11 years of age as at June 30
- Event 2 Must be 11 years of age as at December 31

1.6 Test Team Race Format

The Test Teams will race five (5) motos against one another, with motos spread over two (2) days, as best fits within the host event.

1.7 Lane draws

Eight (8) virtual riders are entered into the computer for the boys:

- BMXNZ will receive four (4) gates and can assign their four (4) team riders in whichever manner they see fit to the four (4) gates assigned to their country (at random by the computer scoring system).
- AC will receive four (4) gates and can assign their four (4) team riders in whichever manner they see fit to the four (4) gates assigned to their country (at random by the computer scoring system).

Eight (8) virtual riders are entered into the computer for the girls:

- BMXNZ will receive four (4) gates and can assign their four (4) team riders in whichever manner
 they see fit to the four (4) gates assigned to their country (at random by the computer scoring
 system).
- AC will receive four (4) gates and can assign their four (4) team riders in whichever manner they see fit to the four (4) gates assigned to their country (at random by the computer scoring system).

Note: all attempts will be made to make the "virtual riders" as anonymous as possible so that the gates assigned represent the country instead of individual riders, within the limits and constraints of computer scoring systems and transponder timing systems.

1.8 Test Team Scoring

Riders are scored on points for their finishing places in the following structure:

1 st	10
2 nd	8
3 rd	6
4 th	5
5 th	4
6 th	3
7 th	2
8 th	1

1.9 Tie Breaker

In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the scoring mechanism, considering the team with the most 1st place finishes, followed by 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place finishes, successively, until a definitive winner emerges.

1.10 Test Team Awards

a. Boys

The winning Male Test Team will receive the Toshiba Cup. The members of the winning Male Test Team will receive commemorative trophies.

b. Girls

The winning Female Test Team will receive the Troy Fisher Cup. The members of the winning Female Test Team will receive commemorative trophies.

1.11 In country Perpetual Awards

c. Australia

Brett Scruse Trophy – Top Test Team Points Scorer for boys and girls have their name engraved on the perpetual trophy, with commemorative trophies to be provided.

d. New Zealand

Ivan Mauger Trophy (Boys) & Jessie Smith Trophy (Girls) – Top Test Team Points Scorer for Boys & Girls wins the Trophies.

2. MIGHTY 11S MEMORIAL CLASS

2.1 Memorial Class Race Format and Scoring

The Mighty 11s Memorial Class will be five (5) motos, Qualifiers and Finals, run over two (2) days.

The Memorial Class will be scored as: Points overall (Including the final)

9-16 riders	 5 motos Top 8 riders on points transfer to finals. Final
17-19 riders	 5 motos Top 12 Riders on points transfer to semi-finals. Top 8 riders points transfer to finals. Finals
20 - 32 riders	 5 motos Top 16 Riders on points transfer to Semi Finals Top 8 riders points transfer to finals. Finals
33-40 Riders	 5 motos Top 20 Riders on points transfer to Quarter Finals Top 16 Riders on points transfer to semi-finals. Top 8 riders points transfer to finals. Finals
41-64 Riders	 5 motos Top 32 Riders on Points transfer through to Quarter Finals Top 16 Riders on Points transfer through to Semi Finals Top 8 Riders on Points transfer to Finals. Finals

2.2 Tied Placings

All tied placings are to be resolved by countback (no runoffs). In the case where a tie is required to be broken, the following process, will apply:

1. Count-back on placing in the last-run stage. If a multi-heat stage, then from the last run to the first run in the stage (until an outcome is reached).

2. Where lap times are available - Count-back on lap time in the last- run stage. If a multi-heat stage, then from the last run to the first run in the stage (until an outcome is reached).

2.3 Memorial Class Age Format

- Event 1 Must be 11 years of age as at June 30
- Event 2 Must be 11 years of age as at December 31

2.4 Memorial Class Gender Format

This is a mixed gender event format.

2.5 Memorial Class Awards

- Overall 3 x Trophies
- Overall 8 x Presentation Plates
- Top Four Girls 4 x Trophies (regardless of overall placing within event)

3.4 Race Schedule

To maximise audience engagement and promote the spectacle The host event shall schedule racing in a way that ensures the M11 class fits into and finishes before the end of the event.

The optimal sequence would be:

- The last memorial class to occur happens end of qualifying moto's racing before Quarters.
- The M11s test Final to happen within the qualifiers to allow for the presentation of awards to be presented between semi & finals.
- Prize giving for memorial should happen in a break before finals starts.
- M11s prize giving should be present at the start of the event prizes giving, so that the teams can do their jersey swap, photos, and farewells, while the main prize giving is on.

4.4 Pre-Event Day Meeting

Prior to racing start, the team management (coach and manager) plus the event commissaire, shall meet to agree on the delivery and intricacies of the M11s format.
